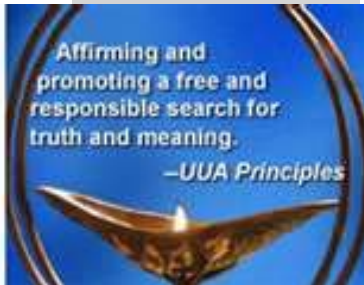

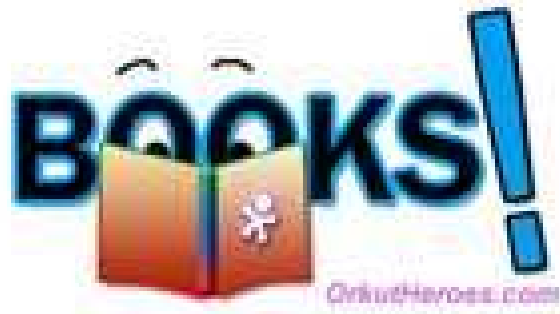
In Memory of Marjorie Sauer
